

SYP Students' Code of Conduct

Students at the School for Young Performers are offered the opportunity to explore and fulfill both personal and academic goals; however, as in a traditional institution, there are certain expectations students are expected to meet as part of SYP's code of conduct.

As a student enrolled in SYP, pupils are expected to:

- Be ready and dressed appropriately to begin class upon the teacher's arrival
- Be prepared with class supplies and completed homework assignments
- Behave in a suitable manner for a schooling environment
- Demonstrate respect for self and others
- Take the course of study seriously and attentively
- Adhere to SYP's "No Social Media" policy: there shall be no communication and/or connecting with teachers via social media while enrolled in SYP
- No phone and/or inappropriate device usage during classes
- With regard to scholarly work, SYP educators and administrators expect our students to adhere to the Honor Code, which is outlined below

SYP's Honor Code:

- All academic work must be done by the individual to whom it's assigned, without unauthorized
 aid of any kind. It is the student's responsibility to be aware of the policy on academic
 misconduct.
- Understand assignments will be checked via plagiarism safeguards
- Comply with the school's zero tolerance toward intentional plagiarism and cheating
- Be willing to accept any swift and fair consequences that may arise in the case of any incidents
